ALERT!

Are you struggling to pay off your student loans? Some debt relief companies claim they can help reduce your monthly payment or get your loans forgiven. But beware, you might be worse off.

Recently I received an email prompting me for more information on my "student forgiveness". The email stated I "had been approved" and all that was required was a one minute phone call at my earliest convenience. I asked my Chief Investigator to call the number in the email. The person who answered hung-up on him when my investigator kept questioning him. This was an email phishing scam and we reported it to the BBB and the FTC.

Signs of a Student Loan Debt Relief Scam:

- Pay an up-front fee.
- No one can promise total loan forgiveness.
- Only scammers will tell you to stop paying your student loans.
- A Department of Education Seal doesn't mean it's legit.
- Scammers try to get you to act fast.

Remember student loans need to be paid back even if you don't graduate. But depending on your situation and the types of loans you have, there may be repayment options for you.

If you have Federal Loans, the Department of Education has different free programs that could help, including:

- Income-driven repayment plans
- Deferment and forbearance
- Loan consolidation
- Loan forgiveness or loan discharge

SCHOEPF DRIVE - WEST NILE VIRUS

From the Summit County Health Department:

I just wanted to let you know that we set a mosquito trap on Schoepf Road on July 19, 2016. Mosquitoes in this trap tested positive for the West Nile virus. It is not uncommon for mosquito traps to test positive for the virus.

Most people who become infected with WNV do not have any symptoms. About one in five people who become infected develop a fever with other symptoms such as headache, body aches, joint pains, vomiting, diarrhea, or rash. Less than 1 percent of infected people develop a serious neurologic illness, such as encephalitis or meningitis (inflammation of the brain or surrounding tissues).

We sprayed a one mile radius around this trap site on August 2, 2016 and will be spraying again on August 11, 2016. In addition, we will be sending technicians out to treat standing water in this area.

After being a star athlete at the old Northfield High School, Arch was drafted and served in a military hospital here in America in WW II. It bothered Arch that he had a safe military job while taking care of wounded servicemen, so he volunteered to be a crew member on a B-17.

On one of his missions, the plane was hit by anti-aircraft fire and Arch was badly wounded in the foot. Despite his pain, he wouldn't parachute out of the cart-wheeling plane until he helped get his buddies out.

After he landed, Arch was briefly accused of being a German spy and luckily the officer who interrogated him was from the Cleveland area. He asked Arch the quickest way to get to downtown Cleveland from the east side and Arch correctly answered "the Rapid".

After a series of painful operations, Arch had to have his foot amputated. He never forgot the sound his foot made when it was thrown into a trash can.

The Cleveland Indians had a minor league contract waiting for him when he went off to war but that dream of course ended.

Arch is a member of The Nordonia High School Athletic Hall of Fame.

He served the Village of Northfield in many capacities over a five decade period of time, including Mayor, Councilman, and on many committees.

Arch Milani was a bone fide member of "The Greatest Generation".





JUNE IS NATIONAL FIREWORKS SAFETY MONTH

Here is an excerpt from Sheriff's The Summit County Shield -June 2016:

Show of hands;

How many readers are planning a trip to the emergency room this summer? How many expect to lose some fingers or one of their eyes? Who's looking forward to some third degree burns? The answer of course, is nobody. No one PLANS, EXPECTS, or HOPES to get hurt this summer, but every year hospitals are filled to capacity with victims who were surprised when "something went wrong" while lighting, holding, or watching fireworks.

June has been chosen as National Fireworks Safety Month because the majority of fireworks are purchased now for use on or around July 4th. If you're thinking of buying fireworks to add some excitement to your backyard celebrations, remember that with the exception of sparklers and other small novelty items like snakes and party poppers, fireworks are illegal for personal use in Ohio. That doesn't prevent the Summit County Sheriff's Office from responding to dozens of calls from citizens complaining their neighbors are launching nuclear weapons. Ordinarily a friendly warning to cease and desist from one of our Deputies is sufficient to dim the 'rockets red glare', but citations can and will be issued if necessary. So what happens if your illegal fireworks

display injures someone or damages their property? You may be found liable in Ohio for penalties under a legal doctrine known as “negligence per se”.

This means that if a jury finds that you violated a law and the violation was a substantial factor in causing injury to the plaintiff, the Judge will instruct the jury they must presume you were negligent. You could then be sued for significant sums of money, not to mention the guilt associated with blinding or maiming someone, perhaps an innocent child, you invited to watch your glorious backyard ‘grand finale’.

The Summit County Sheriff’s Office and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, & Explosives (ATF) warns everyone that illegal explosives and homemade fireworks carry special risks due to their unknown composition and unpredictability. Devices such as M-80’s, block busters, cherry bombs, silver salutes, etc., are illegal because they exceed the permissible powder load and often have a coating of dangerous explosive dust. Friction, heat, and even being bumped can cause such devices to detonate. Therefore, avoid fireworks that are sold on the street or out of someone’s trunk. Above all, avoid mixing alcohol with fireworks use, as that usually adds up to an explosive combination. In short, we suggest that you and your family attend only authorized public fireworks displays conducted by licensed operators.

We want you to be SAFE this summer, not SORRY.

CREDIT CARD "SKIMMER" SCANS.

Credit card 'skimmer' scams have been hitting this area hard. You may have filled up at your local gas station without noticing a thing, but scammers may have attached a skimmer to the card reader. These devices 'skim' your card's information off the magnetic strip. Once the card is run through the skimmer, the data is recorded, the crooks can sell the information on the internet, at which point counterfeit cards are made. The criminals go on spending sprees with a cloned copy of the credit or debit card.

Oftentimes, the crooks have also set up a camera nearby. The camera captures the user typing their card PIN into an ATM machine. With your PIN and skimmed information, scammers can access and withdraw money from your account.

To protect yourself from an ATM skimmer:

- Use ATMs at banks whenever possible, rather than standalone machines;
- Protect your PIN. Place your hand over the keypad when entering your number;
- Look for signs of skimmers. Tape is often used to attach skimming devices; if something looks odd, wiggle it to make sure it doesn't come loose;
- Don't accept "help" from someone other than a bank employee to use the ATM machine, decline and leave;
- Be cautious of ATM failures;
- Report any problems. Only call a number you know is real, such as the one on the back of your card. Don't call a number posted next to the ATM as it could be part of the scam.

If you have been a victim of credit card skimming contact your local authorities and file a police report. Contact your bank or credit card issuer immediately and tell them your card data has been stolen. If you report quickly, federal law caps your liability at \$50.

Discussion of Fire/EMS proposals and related issues with representatives of the Valley Fire District

- Also in attendance: Charlie Riedel (Fire Chief of Valley Fire District) and Amy Anderson (Trustee from Valley Fire District)
- He has been chief for 26 years.
- They have more questions than answers for us. They do not have a proposal. Boston Heights did a contract with the District three years ago and this year it is up.
- Boston Heights had a low call volume of about 150 calls. They used to be a volunteer Fire Department years ago. Now they have 24 hour staffing. 8 hours at Peninsula and 16 hours at Boston Township.
- A very well trained department and they are always applying for grants. The bulk of their land is the park service. They are heavily involved in rope rescues because of the many ledges.
- They use part timers. They use 2 firefighters at their station and they are moved around from Boston Twp to Peninsula and it depends on the time of the day. Utilities are handled by each entity. \$200,000 covers the 2 firefighters.
- Peninsula has about 530 calls per year which is similar to NCT.
- The ski slopes contacted them to cover that area. They transport most patients to the Akron General Wellness in Stow. However, they transport to both Cleveland and Akron depending on where the person wants to go.

- They are on 800 MHz. Richfield does their dispatch. They do not have their own 423 repeater. They could come on our 423 for mutual aid.
- Valley Millage is 6.3 and capital is 2.5. It just brings in \$528,000. They also do the ambulance billing.
- Their chief said that they rely more on mutual aid these days. They need more information to be able to give a ballpark figure. 80% of their time is spent on EMS and not fire.
- Response time is about 7 minutes for their district. 3500 residents within Boston Hts, Boston Twp, and Peninsula but that covers 26 miles.
- They do all their own training and a lot of inspection.
- Their trustees want to see our interest level. They don't want to just give us a proposal and spend all of the time putting it together only to have us go somewhere else.
- Boston Heights does not keep their ambulance billing with their contract.
- They have 3 Fire Engines within their department and they do not need all of them but two of them are approaching the end of their life cycles.
- They are leasing the equipment with Boston Heights but this is just on paper.
- Their chief said they are interested but it depends on our interest level. He also said they still have a year left on the Boston Heights contract so he can't speak for them.
- Chief Riedel said they have a meeting Thursday at 5:30p and they said they will be discussing this. It's a public meeting.
- The two chiefs (Chief Riedel and Chief Risko) will have a meeting to further discuss things.
- They said that they will be neighborly no matter what happens.
- FYI - Boston Heights is not a charter village.
- Our public meeting is tentatively scheduled for May 23rd.

Trustee Reville asked for a Motion for Adjournment at 6:48pm. Trustee Buescher moves for Adjournment. Trustee Romanik seconds the motion. No discussion. R/C Vote: Mr. Romanik-yes; Mr. Buescher-yes; Mr. Reville-yes.

- Also in attendance: Jesse Nehez (Mayor), Jason Buss (Police), and Jen (from the council).
- Chief Buss put together some proposals for NCT.
- Deployment Standards (NFPA – Standard 1710 & 1720) – These deal with numbers of staff.
- NFPA 1720 – Fire fighters from home and come for emergency (This is the past)
- NFPA 1710 – Paid firefighters (Full time or part time). Career firefighters. Staffed 24/7. Most departments in NEO fall into this category. 4 people arrive on one or multiple vehicles to the scene within 5 minutes (90% of the time)
- NFPA 1710 (Guidelines): 1 – Incident commander, 1 – Pump operator, 3 – attack line firefighters, 2- backup firefighters, 2 primary search and rescue firefighters, etc.
- NFPA 1710 Resources used: NVFD – 3 on engine, 1 chief/OIC Response, Recall, MFD – 3 on engine, OFD – 4 on ladder, NCFD – 3 on engine, VFD – 2 on squad.
- NFPA 1710 Medical – calls for 2 basic life support responders and 2 advanced life support responders to medical incidents. 5 minutes for initial response, and 8 minutes arrival
- Advanced Cardiac life support calls for a minimum of 4 responders.
- ISO Deployment Guide – 1st Due Engine Company to receive service credit must be within 1.5 road miles of the incident (3.2 minutes). 1st Due Ladder Service Company must be within 2.5 miles of the incident to receive credit (4.9 minutes). Average Lights and siren response occurs at 35MPH.
- Fire Stations are pretty well placed within our 4 city area.
- NCT – Population is 5800. 5.3 square miles.
- Time is critical – A fire will double every 30 seconds. Flashover can occur within 10 minutes of fire ignition. After 4 – 6 minutes of downtime, permanent brain damage during cardiac arrest sets in.

After 10 minutes of downtime, chances of survival is minimal.

- Response timeline – 911 Time (911 call is answered & dispatched) = 0-2 minutes.
- Minimum staff needed is 3. All staffing deployment must be based off the least ideal scenario, which is minimum manning. Critical medical calls require 2 in the back of the ambulance and a driver. For a fire response, a minimum of 3 is needed to deploy an engine. This allows a pump operator, incident commander/officer, and firefighter to begin deploying lines and starting fire attack. Staff of 3 on the engine is needed.
- Recommending staffing – 3 firefighters 24/7 supported by daily division chief. Will also utilize call back staffing. Division Chief will boost staffing to 4 during office hours. EMS response would be 2 in squad, 1 in chase car. Fire response would be 3 in an Engine. Each station can back up each other.
- Staffing Costs – Based on actual costs to provide a specified level of manpower. NCT retains all ambulance billing, minus collection fees. Includes an administrative fee to manage the manpower, as manpower tends to be the most complicated aspect of fire station management
- Proposal - Contract Date when needed. 6 month cancellation agreement. Could operate under the name of the Northfield Fire Department. Station number 27. We would provide equipment and maintenance of equipment. Monthly off duty training would be needed. NCT would maintain 100% ambulance billing. NCT and NV would work together to develop a capital improvements plan to update the Northfield Center Station and equipped to be determined. NVFD will also charge a 15% administrative fee.
- Recommended staffing – 3 firefighters 24/7 and a Part Time Northfield Center Division Chief (Salary). Multiple Options presented with pricing. Further options can be discussed if need be. For a rough planning estimate, it costs about \$150,000 a year to staff one part time firefighter 24/7. (3 would be \$450,000 total).
- Dispatching – Macedonia does NV's dispatching. Could approach Macedonia. NV is on 800 and we are on 423. This would need to be addressed. Federal funding is a potential option. NCT has a batch of about 12 800's currently. NCT's radios are compatible with NV according to Chief Risko. 911 would work about the same way that it works now for us with the assistance of the Sheriff. With the 3 person coverage, preference would be given to our people. NV has about 35 firefighters to fill 3 positions. The proposal to us is all part timers. Fire District has to be voted on for the Charter for NV. A true fire district would be an interest to NV. Their chief said that it would take a tremendous amount of planning. There would be a lot of hurdles. For NCT to have 3 part timers, we would need to have about 30 firefighters on staff. Initially, turnout gear for all of our part timers would need to be discussed. For NV to supply it all for 30 would be about \$75,000 additional. Many logistics would need to be discussed. Chief Risko said he has enjoyed working with the Village. The mayor said that they will always be the good neighbor no matter what happens.

Trustee Reville asked for a Motion for Adjournment at 6:56pm. Trustee Buescher moves for Adjournment. Trustee Romanik seconds the motion. No discussion. R/C Vote: Mr. Romanik-yes; Mr. Buescher-yes; Mr. Reville-yes.

On Friday, May 6, SR 18/Medina Rd. between Hametown Rd. and I-77 will be restricted to one lane in each direction for a traffic pattern switch. Motorist are asked to avoid the area and expect delays

The detour will be I-77 southbound to I-277 westbound to I-76 eastbound/Kenmore Leg. As a result of the I-76 westbound closure the following ramps will be CLOSED during the same period:

The ramp from I-77 northbound to I-76 westbound will be CLOSED. The detour will be I-277 westbound to I-76 eastbound/Kenmore Leg OR SR 8 northbound to SR 59/Akron Innerbelt.

The ramp from SR 8 southbound to I-76 westbound will be CLOSED. The detour will be I-77

southbound to I-277 westbound to I-76 eastbound/Kenmore Leg.

The ramp from South Main St. to I-76 westbound will be CLOSED. The detour will be S. Main St. to I-277 westbound to I-76 eastbound/Kenmore Leg.

The ramp from Broadway St. to I-76 westbound will be CLOSED. The detour will be. Broadway St. to Thornton St. to Main St. to I-277 westbound to I-76 eastbound/Kenmore Leg.

I-76 between the Kenmore Leg and the Portage County line has various nightly lane restrictions between 7 p.m. and 6 a.m. for concrete pavement repairs. LEGAL NOTICE

TO ALL PROPERTY OWNERS OF NORTHFIELD CENTER TOWNSHIP:
YOU ARE HEREBY NOTIFIED THAT THE FOLLOWING TOWNSHIP ZONING RESOLUTION AND CORRESPONDING SUMMIT COUNTY ORDINANCE IS IN EFFECT IN THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTHFIELD CENTER, AND WILL BE ENFORCED.

SECTION 430.06 OF THE NORTHFIELD CENTER ZONING RESOLUTION, LANDSCAPING AND MAINTENANCE OF YARDS ALONG WITH SUMMIT COUNTY ORDINANCE No. 2011-364 ADOPTED 12-12-11 AMENDING SECTION 521.10, NOXIOUS WEEDS AND RANK VEGETATION.

(a) It is hereby determined that noxious and/or uncultivated weeds, and grass growing at a height in excess of eight inches or higher and/or landscaping that is damaged dead or overgrown including trees, shrubs or gardens, upon any improved property or if it poses a health and safety hazard to surrounding properties even though it might be on an unimproved property within the Township after the first day of May of each year are a public nuisance. For purposes herein, property that has constructed upon it, or in proximity to it, any building or similar structure used or intended to be used as the residence or domicile of persons or as a place of business where persons are present during working hours or any property in a residential subdivision/development to which is extended any improvement required by the Subdivision Regulations, shall be considered improved property. The area designated as the road right-of-way on undeveloped property shall also be maintained in a like manner by the property owner.

(b) The Township is publishing this determination in a newspaper of local circulation and shall make demand that all owners of improved property, and owners of unimproved property for the road right-of-ways in the Township, regularly remove weeds and cut grass, along with maintaining the landscaping on their property which includes removing all damaged, dead or fallen trees and trimming overgrown shrubs, upon their properties during the ensuing months of the year, and maintain the grass below a height of eight inches.

(c) Should any weeds, grass or landscaping defined above be found on any improved property or unimproved property in the road right-of-way or determined as a health and safety hazard on any unimproved property within the Township, after the foregoing publication has been completed, the Zoning Inspector shall cause a written notice to be posted on the property and/or with a certified letter of citation to be sent to the owner of record on the tax duplicate lessee, agent or tenant in charge of such land, notifying him that the weeds and/or grass are growing or landscaping is not maintained on such lands and that they must be cut, destroy, trimmed or removed within 5 Days after the service of such notice. The posted notice on the property will serve as the date of the start of the 5 days. If the owner, lessee, agent or tenant having charge of the lands fails to comply with the above notice, the Zoning Inspector shall cause all weeds herein to be removed, grass to be cut, landscaping to be trimmed and damaged or dead trees or shrubs to be cut, trimmed and/or removed at the expense of the Township. Thereupon, the expense of all necessary work, including but not limited to cutting, mowing, raking, applying weed killer and removing debris along with administrative fees involved shall be billed to the property owner by certified mail. Upon his failure to reimburse the Township this amount within thirty days thereafter, the Township Fiscal Officer shall make written return to the County Auditor of the Zoning Inspector's action with a statement of the charges for the services, including all services referred to above, the fees of the officers who made the service, the notice and return, and a proper description of the premises, and a request that all such cost and fees be entered upon the tax duplicate and a lien upon such lands from and after the date of the entry which shall be collected as other taxes and be returned to the Township according to law. Discussion of Fire District Topics:

Mayor Joe Migliorini present

Joe (Macedonia Fire Chief)

- Joe Migliorini and Tim were invited about the proposal for Fire and EMS Service.
- Macedonia is offering to do contract and \$375,000 is the proposal. This would cover our community. This would be a very similar deal to the Sagamore Hills one.
- Intent is to station 2 people here in conjunction with people in Sagamore and people at Macedonia.
- There would probably be 8 during the day and 5 at night across the boundaries.
- They are looking at a GPS System. It would not just be 2 at Northfield, it would be in conjunction with everyone.
- Trustee Reville asked if there would be a third person that would back them up. It is typically a 2 person job. The other person does a lot of the extras. The third person would be a chase vehicle.

How would dispatching be handled?

- Calls would be forwarded to Macedonia unless other arrangements made. They would be using our repeaters (The 423's). Macedonia is looking to go to the 800's because they are being pushed. This would probably be in the 5 year plan. On the technical side, everything would be about the same. 911 could be kept with the sheriff for the short term. It would be sorted through.
- Macedonia runs a combination with staff. They have full timers and part timers. They run with 4 around the clock (On the weekends they run with 5). Part timers are harder to find because of their other jobs.
- Trustee Buescher stated that the NCT FD currently isn't a volunteer department. Chief Tim said that the state refers to part time employees as a volunteer department even though they are paid. This name is not meant to be derogatory. –
- NCT has extensive background checks. Full timers are scored with their testing. Their chief can take the top 10 applicants. They have used Pradco for psychological testing. Drug testing and background is handled by Security and Polygraph Testing.

- NCT has approx. 30 firemen in our department. Of the 30, 12 are full time with other departments. If we went with Macedonia proposal, all fd's at the dictrict would need to apply. Their chief said he would take them all. You don't utilize them until they need them. He said that he would probably have them working here at NCT (at least initially). They are always looking for good quality firemen and he said that we definitely have them here at NCT.
- There are written and hands on tests, but this will not be much of an issue. This would be an easy transition. All Macedonia's training is done in house.
- Trustee Buescher said that he initially wanted to know how much more it would be for them to staff 3 here at NCT. This was before we knew how they were going to handle things.
- Firefighters are here to serve the communities according to Chief Tim. They are here for the public.
- Equipment would be up for negotiation. A medic and a fire engine would be needed here.
- Trustee Buescher said that he likes the idea of regionalization but would like the goal to be a Nordonia Hills Fire District. He also talked about the charter needing to be changed. Mayor Migliorini hasn't looked too deeply into changing charters but he thinks his residents would be in favor if it is saving everyone money. Mayor Migliorini said that he thinks regionalization is necessary. You either ask tax payers for money or find other ways to do things. The ultimate goal is that everyone should sit down and we should strive to be one true community again. There are lots of positives to becoming one district. He thinks that the policing could go the same route as a fire district. He thinks it could be easier because there isn't as much equipment.
- Police and Fire Retirement would be covered. Healthcare would also be covered. The only variable with the \$375,000 would be the equipment. We would keep the ambulance billing. In the event that there was a termination in the contract, if there were 4 full timers, we would need to pick up 2 (As an example). Numbers of people could depend on a lot of situations (Summer time, vacation, not wanting to work on weekend, etc). This works out better with each community that comes along.
- First year hire (inception), compensation package with everything included is about \$85,000.
- Brandywine ski area – There are a tremendous number of calls that could revert from the Valley Fire District to Sagamore. Trustee Buescher asked if the chief was aware of this. He said that he was aware. There are no out of pocket expenses but they take what the insurance covers. The chief would work very closely with the ski patrol to determine what is an emergency (Example – broken finger is not an emergency)? He would want to make sure that every injury goes to the right medical facility. Valley likes Brandywine because they are well paid for servicing that area. Good Coverage is a priority with Macedonia.
- Sagamore Hills contract states a 20% increase dealing with a certain number of calls. The chief believes in constant communication to solve a problem. Sagamore calls would not be included in Northfield's calls. The Chief believes in this agreement. The aerial tower, rescue equipment skills, structural trailers, etc. will be able to be used for NCT.
- Macedonia would be willing to help out with grants. Their chief said the grants would be easier to get with any type of community consolidation. Macedonia has a grant writer and we could use them.
- Macedonia's population is about 11,500.
- Macedonia goes after every grant on every level.
- We would be over 3000 calls for the Macedonia, Sagamore, and Northfield communities combined.
- Trustee Reville asked if they had looked at our facilities yet and they said that they had not yet. He

said that there would be an increase in service level. You would get more for your money by using Macedonia.



Interstate 480 in the City of Twinsburg, Macedonia & Hudson and Twinsburg Township (Wednesday, April 27 – until Further Notice)

Beginning Wednesday evening, April 27, I-480 between the Portage County line and the Cuyahoga County line will have various nightly lane restrictions between 6 p.m. and 6 a.m. for microsurfacing. This work is the beginning of a \$1.8 million project to microsurface I-480 between Portage County line and the Cuyahoga county line. The entire project is schedule to be completed by late June 2016.

State Route 82 in the City of Macedonia (until further notice)

SR 82 between Alexandria Dr. and Longwood Park is reduced to one ten foot lane in each direction for roadway widening. This work is part of a \$4.6 million project to resurface and widen SR 82 between Alexandria Drive and the Twinsburg Corporation limit. The entire project is scheduled to be completed by September 2016.

State Route 91 in the City of Twinsburg (until further notice)

SR 91 between Post Rd. and Glenwood Dr. has various daily lane restrictions for drainage installation and widening of the northbound side of SR 91. This work is part of a \$4.7 million project to widen and reconstruct SR 91 between Post Rd. and Glenwood Dr. The project also includes drainage repairs and the installation of a roundabout on SR 91 and Glenwood Dr. The entire project is scheduled to be completed by November 2016.

Interstate 271 in the City of Macedonia (until further notice)

SR 82 between SR 8 and S. Bedford Rd. will have various nightly lane restrictions for roadway repairs.

(until further notice)

I-271 between SR 8 and the Cuyahoga County line has various lane restrictions for roadway widening. ***The speed limit in this area is reduced to 50 mph during construction.*** This work is part of a \$50.9 million project to reconstruct and widen I-271 between SR 8 and the Cuyahoga County line. The entire project is scheduled to be completed by October 2016.

REVISED FIRE/EMS SERVICES PROPOSAL TO SAGAMORE HILLS TOWNSHIP: April 18, 2016

Dear Sagamore Hills Board of Trustees:

As you are aware we are contemplating the resurrection of the Northfield Center Fire Department due to the dissolving of our mutual Fire District. On April 4, 2016, we offered you a proposal for a contracted fire/ems service, which you chose not to accept.

In an effort to continue the forty-year relationship between our communities, we are submitting, for your review and approval, a revised proposal for Sagamore Hills to contract Fire/EMS with the Northfield Center Fire Department. This new and revised proposal for your community will not exceed \$700,000.00 for the first year.

Please respond to this proposal by 4:30 pm on Friday, April 29, 2016.

We look forward to many more decades of renewed cooperation and service for the residents of Sagamore Hills. The following is a brief synopsis of our proposal:

PROPOSED AGREEMENT OF SERVICES

A. All Fire and EMS equipment shall be housed at the Northfield Center Fire Station, located at 60 W. Aurora Road, Northfield Center, Ohio, 44067.

B. Northfield Center will assume all fire station renovation and/or replacement costs.

C. Staffing: 24/7 coverage:

3-4 personnel from 6 am – 10 am

4 personnel from 10 am – 6 am

D. Five Year Contract:

Year 1: \$700,000.00

Year 2: \$700,000.00 plus any additional negotiated raises

Years 3-5: Open to negotiations based on review of actual service levels

E. Sagamore Hills will retain all of Sagamore Hills ambulance billing proceeds provided that all Fire District vehicle titles be transferred to Northfield Center AND all other District equipment be relinquished to Northfield Center.

F. If "E" (above) is acceptable, then Northfield Center will assume all maintenance costs on the aforementioned described equipment.

G. If "E" is not acceptable, then Northfield Center will retain all ambulance billing proceeds and Sagamore Hills will supply all vehicles and other equipment deemed necessary by the Northfield Center FD AND Sagamore Hills shall be responsible for all maintenance of said vehicles and equipment.

H. This proposal is subject to final contract negotiations between Northfield Center Township and Sagamore Hills Township.

NOTE 1: According to figures supplied by Sagamore Hills, this proposal will save them \$180,000 for the first year compared to the recent proposal from the City of Macedonia. (i.e., \$50,000 off the yearly contract cost, no need for the \$50,000 Sagamore building renovation and \$80,000 towards NCT fire station estimated renovation costs per year).

NOTE 2: Fire and EMS service levels will remain the same as it has been since the formation of the Fire District in 2010.

TO NORTHFIELD CENTER TOWNSHIP RESIDENTS:

With the abrupt reception of a letter from Sagamore Hills Township giving six months' notice of withdrawal from the Northfield Center-Sagamore Hills Fire District, it became apparent that additional Fire/EMS funding would be needed to reconstitute and maintain the Northfield Center Fire Department.

Waiting until the November 2016 General Election was not an option, so the only option was to submit a Fire/EMS Levy to the Board of Elections by the May 4, 2016 deadline in order to insure the levy 's placement on the August 2, 2016 ballot. The first step will take place on April 18, 2016 when the Board will possibly vote on the mandatory "Resolution of Necessity" to be sent to the Summit County Fiscal Officer. The second step will be another special meeting to vote on placing a Fire/EMS Levy on the August 2, 2016 ballot.

A Town Hall meeting will be conducted after the above procedures are successfully completed. There will be time for the Trustees to withdraw the Levy.

To resurrect the Northfield Center Fire Department (NCFD), it has been determined that a 6-mill replacement levy would be needed. We currently operate on a 2-mill levy so this would be an increase of 4-mills. Currently, the 2-mill levy costs the owner of a \$100,000 home \$61.26 per year and generates \$313,499 of revenue. A 6-mill levy would cost the owner of a \$100,000 home \$210.00 per year and would generate \$940,496 per year. This would be the minimum amount of revenue required to resurrect the NCFD.

'Voting' FOR this increase would keep services the same as they are now and would keep all 30 of our firefighters and paramedics.

'Voting' AGAINST this increase would eliminate our Fire Department and force us to contract with another community and we would lose most of our firefighters and paramedics. A smaller levy increase would still be needed to pay for any contracted or consolidated service.



ALERT!

My office has received many calls from concerned citizens regarding companies that call and claim they work with the U.S. Treasury. These fraudulent companies demand payment for taxes owed and threaten to have you arrested if not paid immediately by credit card.

I looked into this and found this is an aggressive and sophisticated phone scam targeting taxpayers and has been making the rounds throughout the country. Callers claim to be employees of the IRS or a company affiliated with the IRS. These con artists can sound convincing when they call. They use fake names and bogus IRS identification badge numbers.

I was saddened to learn that thousands of victims have already lost money to these tax scam artists. But there are ways to protect yourself.

Note that the IRS will never:

- Call to demand immediate payment, nor will the agency call about taxes owed without first having mailed you a bill.
- Demand that you pay taxes without giving you the opportunity to question or appeal the amount they say you owe.
- Require you to use a specific payment method for your taxes, such as a prepaid debit card.
- Ask for credit or debit card numbers over the phone.
- Threaten to bring in local police to have you arrested for not paying.

If you don't owe taxes or have no reason to think that you do:

- Contact the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration. Use TIGTA's "IRS Impersonation Scam Reporting" web page to report the incident;
- You should also report it to the Federal Trade Commission. Use the "FTC Complaint Assistant" on FTC.gov. Please add "IRS Telephone Scam" to the comments of your report.

Dear Paul, Rich and John:

We are writing you this letter to give you six months notice of our intent to withdrawal from the Northfield Center- Sagamore Hills Fire District pursuant to the Terms and Conditions of our Contract. Our District Agreement provides that after the initial three year term of the District "...any member may elect to withdraw upon six (6) months written notice to the District." We are providing this notice of our intent to enter into a contract with the City of Macedonia to provide regional Fire and EMS services to our community.

As you know, over the past several months Trustees from both Sagamore Hills Township and Northfield Center Township have been meeting with representatives from the City of Macedonia to explore regionalizing services among our communities including Fire and EMS services. Regionalizing these services would enhance our coverage with Macedonia's full-time fire service. Additionally regionalization would likely save tax dollars.

The creation of our current Fire District in 2010 was the culmination of the study and discussions about creating a regional Fire and EMS Service between our communities, the City of Macedonia, the Village of Northfield and the Village of Boston Heights. While the results of that study and discussions did not regionalize Fire and EMS services between all of the communities, it did enhance the mutual aid relationship between the communities and lead to the creation of our Fire District.

State funding cuts from Ohio to all local governments have only added to our tightening local budgets. These changes have created new challenges as we seek to maintain and enhance services without raising new taxes. Our Fire District has helped us each balance our budgets and has been a real success. We have worked together to provide high quality Fire and EMS services to our communities without new taxes. Despite this success we have

together learned that there are many additional challenges that we face which will require new additional revenue. If we remain with the Fire District we know the District will need our community to contribute additional money for such items as new additional capital equipment (expected to be at least \$127,000 per year for the next five years) and significant renovations to the existing out dated station (estimated to be at least \$80,000.00 per year for the next five years). Chief Risko has further repeatedly told the Board of the challenges we face in recruiting high quality firefighter/paramedics. Last year we had new challenges from the loss of the twenty-four hour emergency room in our community making EMS runs longer and requiring additional staffing at our station.

As community leaders we have long discussed the benefits of regionalizing our services, especially in light of the recent cuts in State funding. Last year we contracted our Police Dispatch Services with the City of Macedonia. Even Chief Risko has commented in recent District meetings upon the success of this Contract.

We believe a regional approach to Fire and EMS services is a reasonable solution to these challenges that will ensure we better utilize our tax dollars without duplicate equipment and services. The days of operating our Fire District as a part-time volunteer department are simply not possible like they were in the past. We can see the clear benefits of combining our resources with Macedonia's long-standing high quality full-time Fire Department and help build it into an even better regional Fire Department with at a level of service at least at our current level if not better. The combination of Police Dispatch, Fire and EMS services between our community and the City of Macedonia will help coordinate and enhance the level of services to our residents. This regionalization will ensure not just high quality services for our community but for better services for our entire region.

We intend to operate these new Fire and EMS services out of our current facilities on Valley View Road, where we can house Fire and EMS equipment within our own existing facilities and buildings. The next six month period will allow both of our communities to prepare all of our residents for this change. It is our hope that Northfield Center Township will continue to participate in the on-going discussions with the City of Macedonia about the regionalization of Fire and EMS services for all of our communities. We further hope that Northfield Center Township will join with Sagamore Hills Township in regionalizing to enhance Fire and EMS services.

We look forward to continuing our membership in the Fire District as we make this transition to Macedonia and appreciate the long-term and productive relationship we have had with Northfield Center Township.

PROCLAMATION - MARCH 7, 2016

On the evening of January 11, 2016, an explosion and fire devastated a home at 7486 Skyhaven Drive in Northfield Center Township. An entire family – mother, father, and two little girls perished in this terrible incident.

Before the Fire Department was dispatched, and in an effort to rescue anyone in the home, neighbors Randy Nickschinski, Nathan Nickschinski, and Jim Russo tried to enter the home to search for the family. Randy kicked in the front door and the family dog ran out. The three men searched the first floor of the burning home for the family and finally were driven back by the fire. Randy Nickschinski entered the home again but his search was in vain.

An alarm was received at the Fire District at 8:45 p.m. by Summit County Dispatch which indicated by callers that there was an explosion and a home was fully engulfed in flame with the possibility of residents still inside. Northfield Center – Sagamore Hills Fire District 27 personnel and equipment were on the scene at 8:51 p.m. An exterior fire attack began immediately. Fire Chief Frank Risko took command and received mutual aid from Macedonia, Oakwood Village, Twinsburg, Northfield Village, and the Valley Fire District. The quick response of the neighboring fire departments resulted in the fire being controlled in a short amount of time.

Summit County Deputy Sheriff Wes Dobbins assisted in traffic control and general assistance to the fire firefighters. Deputy Catherine Phillips attempted to enter the house initially through the front door and then she partially opened the garage door to effect a rescue of the family, but the intensity of the fire was too great. Lead Detective Jason Kline and Detective Michelle Porter were in charge of the investigation and Deputy Corey Thompson arrived with the Crime Scene Unit.

The home was entered after the fire was under control and Chief Risko notified State Fire Marshal Larry Flowers who responded with Lead Fire Marshal Brian Peterman, and two other Fire Marshals. Northfield Center Road Foreman Frank Buehner salted Skyhaven to facilitate safe road conditions and the Red Cross provided the fire fighters warm drinks and food from their van.
